

GETTYSBURG

They will show you the field where the battle was actually fought.



Do not be misled by the word "FIELD." It covers 16,000 acres, has 2,390 monuments, 415 cannons and 26 miles of paved Avenues.

You will see where all the main events took place, where Lincoln delivered his immortal Gettysburg Address, where he stayed overnight and also such well known places as The Eternal Peace Light, Spangler's Spring, National Cemetery, High Water Mark, The Round Tops, Wheatfield, Peach Orchard, Devil's Den, and many others.



The tour is made in your own car. You start at your own convenience—no waiting for a scheduled time. The GUIDE will stop at places of greatest interest and will take you to any place that may be of special interest to you, providing reasonable time is observed.



THE LICENSED BATTLEFIELD GUIDES

The GUIDES were organized in 1915 under the War Department. In 1933 the Park and the GUIDES were transferred to the National Park Service, United States Department of the Interior.

Every GUIDE dressed in a khaki uniform is licensed by the National Park Service and receives his license only after an extensive examination by the Superintendent of the Park. There are 55 Government Licensed Guides.

BUS TOURS:


The price for the standard \$8.00 tour for a trip of 1½ to \$8.00 per bus
